Materials	Journal: Good Deeds printable
	■ Crayons
Preparation	Before class, reflect on a recent good deed someone did for you. You will be telling students about the experience in one or two sentences.
	Print a copy of Journal: Good Deeds printable for each student.
Background	Tell students that 9/11 Day is a national day of service, which means helping or doing things for other people.
	It is also a day of remembrance, when we honor the thousands of people who died in a series of events on September 11, 2001.
	Point out that after 9/11, people did kind things for each other and served their communities together.
Introduction	Write "good deed" on the board.
	Ask students to share what they think it means when someone does a good deed.
	Tell students that a good deed is when you do something kind and helpfu for others without expecting anything in return.
	Tell students in one or two sentences about a time someone did a good deed for you recently. Be sure to name the emotions you felt as a result.
Activity	Have students reflect in their journals by using the Journal: Good Deeds printable to draw a picture of a good deed someone did for them or a good deed they witnessed.
	If students have trouble thinking of a good deed, encourage them to draw a good deed they would like to do.
	As time permits, have students share and explain their drawing.
